- CFR1910.1200 Hazard communication
- CFR1910.1450 Occupational exposure to hazardous chemicals in laboratories

Labeling for secondary containers should be the responsibility of the person who actually fills the secondary container. In addition to the name and hazards of the product, it is important for that same individual to *initial* and date the container.

All containers must be labeled with at least the name and hazard class (e.g., acetone, flammable.) Containers with unknown contents are considered a serious safety issue. The Principle Investigator is responsible for all costs incurred for product analysis and disposal of unlabeled containers. Original manufacturer's container labels must not be obscured while the material is in storage or use. For additional information contact Mahdi Fahim@ncsu.edu
